The Railbelt Reliability Council (RRC) Board held its regular monthly meeting via Zoom on Monday, November 3, 2025. The meeting was recorded in accordance with RRC Rule ER7. The meeting was called to order by Chair Lou Florence at 1:30 p.m.

3. Approval of Agenda

Director Groves made a motion to approve the agenda; Director Rudeck seconded. Discussion was opened on the motion. There being no discussion and hearing no objection, Chair Florence declared the motion APPROVED.

4. Director Disclosures

6. Consent Agenda

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Chair Florence invited revisions or comments on any specific consent agenda items. Director Groves made a motion to approve the consent agenda as presented; Director Hickey seconded. There being no discussion and hearing no objections, Chair Florence declared the consent agenda APPROVED.

7. Reports

- a. Chief Executive Officer Report
 - CEO Jenkin provided a verbal update in addition to the CEO written report.
 - CIP Standards The public comment period is open until December 14, 2025.
 - Integrated Resource Plan (IRP) Black and Veatch was awarded the contract, and a kick-off meeting is scheduled November 4, 2025, with a press release forthcoming.
 - Stage 1 Load Shed Event A recent loss of generation effected individuals across the Railbelt.

Alternate Greene inquired about the proposed schedule from Black & Veatch. CEO Jenkin responded the schedule would be reviewed during the kickoff meeting.

Alternate Dennis suggested written documentation of significant outages to support compliance and facilitate learning. CEO Jenkin acknowledged and agreed to consider the recommendation.

[Alternate Lister joined the meeting at 1:40pm]

Director Groves noted PRC-006, the under-frequency load shed standard, may be relevant once under development, to include reporting requirements. Alternate Greene cautioned the RRC about becoming involved in operational aspects of post-event analysis.

Director Groves also proposed adding Director email addresses to the RRC website for public accessibility, per a determination from November 2023 Executive Committee (ExCom) meeting. CEO Jenkin requested a copy of the related documentation. Director Heckman noted ER3 & ER4 Working Group has resumed activity and may can include this in the product development process.

Director McDonnell mentioned the Value of Lost Load Study developed by ACEP and requested access to the report. CEO Jenkin clarified the document is an initial draft and will be made public upon completion.

[Shaina Kilcoyne joined the meeting at 1:46 p.m. and Alternate Baker joined the meeting at 1:47 p.m.]

Alternate Greene asked about the RTO's transition away from grandfathered agreements. CEO Jenkin responded his comments reflect his personal views and not the official position of the RTO. He noted the need for changes depends on the specifics of each agreement.

Director Florence raised the topic of CMEP documents, suggesting it be brought to ExCom for further discussion.

Director McDonnell requested information on where to find a graphic indicator of standards under development and an overview of the process. CEO Jenkin provided guidance on locating this information on the RRC website.

Director Rudeck referenced the CEO Goals presentation used during the Legislative Lunch & Learn in Juneau, and offered to share the PowerPoint presentation with the Board.

b. Executive Committee (ExCom)



Chair Florence provided a verbal update in addition to the written report. He noted the IRP contract was reviewed and approved by ExCom on behalf of the Board. He also highlighted ongoing discussions the Business Process documents under development by the RRC.

c. Finance and Audit Committee (FACom)

Treasurer Hickey provided a verbal update in addition to the written report. He noted the third special FACom meeting was held on October 17, 2025, and the finalized budget is before the Board today for approval.

d. Governance Committee (GovCom)

No additional comments.

e. Public Involvement Committee (PICom)

Director Kiley-Bergen provided a verbal update in addition to the Website Analytics Report. She noted an upcoming meeting with Business Manager Wilson and Administrative Coordinator Green to review website analytics data. She also shared, per CEO Jenkin, PICom is expected to reconvene after the IRP contractors are established. However, Chair Florence clarified the timing of the meeting is at Director Kiley-Bergen's discretion.

8. Unfinished Business

a. None.

9. New Business

a. Resolution 20251103-01 - 2026 RRC Budget

Director Hickey moved to approve Resolution 20251103-01 to approve the RRC 2026 Budget; Director Heckman seconded. Director Groves recommended, prior to filing the 2026 Budget, the Gantt chart scale be adjusted to provide a more focused view, noting it currently spans 70 years. RRC Staff confirmed they will make the necessary adjustments before submitting the budget to the Regulatory Commission of Alaska (RCA). Discussion also noted the robust process and Board involvement in the development of the budget. There being no further discussion and hearing no objection to the motion, Chair Florence declared the motion APPROVED.

b. Resolution 20251103-02 - RCA Tariff Filing - 2026 Surcharge

Director Rudeck moved to approve Resolution 20251103-02 RCA Tariff Filing – 2026 Surcharge; Director Groves seconded. CEO Jenkin provided comments regarding the surcharge calculation and the development of the tariff sheets. He explained the timing of the filing aligns with October's balancing account estimates. There being no further discussion and hearing no objection to the motion, Chair Florence declared the motion APPROVED.

c. Resolution 20251103-03 RRC-TPL-001 and RRC-TPL002

Director Heckman moved to approve Resolution 20251103-03 RRC-TPL001-1 and RRC-TPL002-1; Director Hickey seconded. CEO Jenkin provided a brief recap of the development history of the standards. Chair Florence acknowledged the significant time and effort invested in the process, commending the successful outcome. There being no further discussion and hearing no objection to the motion, Chair Florence declared the motion APPROVED.

d. Resolution 20251103-04 Bylaws Version Six Adoption

Director Heckman moved to approve Resolution 20251103-04 Bylaw Revision Six – Modify Section 2.4; Director Hickey seconded. Alternate Dennis introduced the changes made in the Bylaws Section 2.4 Board Committees. There being no further discussion and hearing no objection to the motion, Chair Florence declared the motion APPROVED.

e. Resolution 20251103-05 Directive to CEO to Initiate Development of Value Statement

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Director Groves moved to approve Resolution 20251103-05 Directive to CEO to Develop Value Statement Rule; Director McDonnell seconded. CEO Jenkin noted the development of a Value Statement was part of a prior agreement, with a commitment to complete it within two years of the CEO's hiring. Director Groves referenced Resolution 20221205-02, which prioritized the development of the Value Statement. Business Manager Wilson clarified the earlier resolution was directed to the Board, not specifically to the CEO.

Groves moved to amend the resolution to add a whereas clause at the top of the resolution that states, "Whereas, on December 5, 2022, the Railbelt Reliability Council (RRC) passed Resolution 20221205-02 prioritizing the development of the value statement; and"; Director Hickey seconded. Discussion was opened on the amendment. There being no discussion and hearing no objection, Chair Florence declared the amendment APPROVED.

Discussion reopened on the motion to approve Resolution 20251103-05. There being no further discussion and hearing no objection to the motion, Chair Florence declared the motion APPROVED.

f. Motion 20251103-01 - Alrich Advisor Sole Source Contract

Director Hickey moved to approve Motion 20251103-01 Sole Source Authorization – Auditor Services; Director Groves seconded. CEO Jenkin introduced the justification for selecting Aldrich Advisors as the sole source provider of independent audit services, citing their qualifications and alignment with RRC's needs. There being no further discussion and hearing no objection to the motion, Chair Florence declared the motion APPROVED.

g. Motion 20251103-02 – BP201 Board Fees and Reimbursement Policy Director Heckman moved to approve Motion 20251103-02 Modification of BP201 – Board Fees; Director Hickey seconded. CEO Jenkin introduced the request, noting the revised policy had been reviewed and updated by GovCom.

Director Groves moved to amend the table 3.0 Definitions – Board Committee definition to insert "RRC Bylaws;" Director Hickey seconded. Discussion opened on the motion. Director Groves stated this change provides more context. There being no discussion and hearing no objection to the amendment, Chair Florence declared the amendment APPROVED.

Director Groves moved to amend the table 3.0 Definitions – Stakeholder Class to add "For this policy only;" Director Rudeck seconded. Discussion opened on the motion. Director Groves stated the amendment clarifies the definition applies specifically to this policy. There being no discussion and hearing no objection to the amendment, Chair Florence declared the amendment APPROVED.

Discussion reopened on the motion to approve Motion 20251103-02. There being no further discussion and hearing no objection to the motion, Chair Florence declared the motion APPROVED.

h. Motion 20251103-03 – Winfluence Strategies Sole Source Authorization

Director Heckman moved to approve Motion 20251103-03 Sole Source Authorization - Winfluence; Director Groves seconded. CEO Jenkin introduced the request, explaining Winfluence would provide support to the RRC during the Legislative Session in Juneau. Director Rudeck asked whether the amount presented was an annual total, and CEO Jenkin clarified it is a one-year contract. Director Kiley-Bergen asked about the topic of the upcoming Lunch and Learn session, and CEO Jenkin responded it would be a general overview of RRC activities. Chair Florence emphasized the importance of educating legislators and their staff about the RRC's work. There being no further discussion and hearing no objection to the motion, Chair Florence declared the motion APPROVED.

i. Governance Committee Chair Confirmation

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Chair Florence announced Alternate Dennis will be stepping down from the Board effective December 31, 2025. Due to other obligations in the meantime, Alternate Dennis may not be able to attend all GovCom meetings through the end of the year. As a result, Chair Florence requested Director Heckman assume GovCom Chair responsibilities for the remainder of the year.

Director Rudeck moved for Director Heckman to serve as the Chair of GovCom for the remainder of the year in place of Alternate Dennis; Director Groves seconded. There being no further discussion and hearing no objection to the motion, Chair Florence declared the motion APPROVED.

10. Member Comments, Discussion of Railbelt Activities, and Requests for Future Agenda Items

- Chair Florence expressed appreciation for the recent workshop, thanked RRC staff and FACom for their work on the budget, and acknowledged the engagement of Board members. He emphasized the breadth of work being undertaken by the RRC and encouraged continued participation, noting opportunities to engage are available on the Calendar of Events.
- Director Hickey thanked FACom and RRC Staff for their efforts in preparing the budget.
- Director Kumar reflected on the progress made in standards development and expressed satisfaction
 with the IRP process and the budget. He emphasized the importance of maintaining focus on
 delivering tangible results for consumers, particularly in the areas of costs, reliability, and sustainability.
- Director Groves reiterated appreciation for RRC Staff and the Board, recognizing the significance of the work being brought forward. He also noted a correction needed on page three of the Board Packet regarding seat information, indicating his affiliation should be updated to AIPPA.
- Alternate Shepherd commended RRC Staff and Board members for the high caliber of discussion and the integrity demonstrated throughout the meeting.

SUBJECT: CEO Report for December 1, 2025, Board Meeting

Legislative and Regulatory Activities

- RRC
 - The Board approved budget and Surcharge were filed with the Regulatory Commission of Alaska (RCA) on November 17, 2025.
 - No comments received by the RCA on the CIP Standards filing. The matter remains open until December 15, 2025, unless the commission suspends the filing.
- RTO
 - The RRC filed a brief on November 14, 2025, declining to offer responses to questions directed to the RTO.

Standards

- Operational and Planning Standards
 - The TAC Recommendation for the RRC-TPL-001-1 and RRC-TPL-002-2 has been approved by the Board and is scheduled to be filed with the RCA in early December.
 - Working group meetings are under way focusing on the process associated with Facilities Standards, FAC-001: Facility Interconnection requirements, and FAC-002: Coordination of Plans for new generation, transmission, and end-user facilities.
 - Working group meetings are under way to develop the RRC Definitions of Standard Terms.
 - There were no comments or dissents on the Manager's recommendation of the VRF/VSL tables that will amend the RCA and RRC Board approved standards. TAC Recommendation will follow at the January Board meeting.
 - Sanction guidelines are before the Board for action.
- CIP Standards

These standards have been filed with the RCA.

IRP

- The contract was awarded to Black and Veatch, and Staff had an initial kick-off meeting with them. A joint press release has been reviewed by both parties. Work is underway on Webinar Material. Working group meetings are expected to start mid-December.
- ACEP provided their report on their literature research associated with developing an Alaskan value of lost load (VoLL). We have also received cost and timeline estimates for options to determine the Railbelt VoLL. An item is on the Board agenda.

RRC Organizational Documents

- ER3/ER4 Working Group The second working group meeting was held on November 20, 2025.
- Additional licenses have been procured for LaserFiche to provide capabilities to share files with Board Members, and not the public.
- 2026 Contract renewals are underway.
- Foraker has completed their work efforts associated with the triannual review.

RRC Board Officer Elections

The Chair solicited the interest of current Board officers in serving another year. All responded affirmatively. In view of the Chair, the current officers have properly discharged their duties on the Executive Committee (ExCom). Therefore, the Chair will propose the re-election of the officers as a slate at the December board meeting. If board members want to nominate other candidates as officer, each election will be managed individually at the board meeting.

RRC Current Role in Response to Reliability Events

ExCom recently discussed whether the RRC has a current report in investigating or analyzing current reliability events on the Railbelt grid. The example that prompted the discussion was the underfrequency event that occurred in recent weeks. Discussion of the ExCom, other Board members, and the RRC staff developed a couple of points. First, there is a need to ensure that such events are investigated and analyzed so that lessons can be learned to improve the reliability of the Railbelt grid. Even after the reliability standards are implemented, the CMEP alone will not ensure lessons learned are developed and shared across the Railbelt. The second point made was the current authorities for the RRC to act do not include such an investigative function.

Legislation Impacting the RRC

ExCom will discuss the RRC's approach to legislative proposals that may impact the RRC. This discussion will take place during the December 15, 2025, ExCom committee meeting. The RRC does not engage in legislative advocacy. However, last year's legislative session made it clear there was a need for the RRC to provide education to legislators and staff on the RRC and the impacts to the RRC of legislation being discussed.

Board Training and Workshops

ExCom continues to implement Board training and workshops recommended by the Governance Committee. Previous Board training recordings can be found on the RRC's Document Repository.

2025 In-Person RRC Board Meetings

December is the last in-person meeting of 2025. In-person attendance is encouraged for these meetings. In the interest of ensuring attendance by all board members, remote attendance options will be available for all Board meetings.

Executive Committee Business

Triennial Governance Review

Article 8 of the RRC's Bylaws require that no later than three years after the Regulatory Commission of Alaksa (RCA) certifies the RRC as an electric reliability organization, and at least every three years thereafter, Governance Committee (GovCom) must review the Bylaws, governance policies, and rules on file with the RCA. The purpose of this review is to identify areas for improvement or supplementation, ensuring compliance with regulations under 3 AAC 46.060(b)(4). Staff, along with the Foraker Group, recently completed their analysis of the RRC's Bylaws, governance policies, and rules on file and presented a high-level finding at the Committee meeting held November 14, 2025. The Triennial Review is a part of the 2025 Annual Report which will be presented to the Board at the January Board of Directors meeting.

2026 CEO Goals

At its November 7, 2025, meeting GovCom finalized the 2026 goals for the Chief Executive Officer (CEO), a copy of which is included as an informational item in this packet.

CEO Performance and Compensation Process

At both its November meetings, GovCom discussed the CEO's 2025 performance and compensation for 2026 as well as the CEO evaluation process overall. GovCom adopted a CEO evaluation form as a form to be used for future evaluations. GovCom also recommended a cost-of-living increase to the CEO of 2.4% based on the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics Consumer Price Index for the Anchorage area ending August 2025.

Procedures with CTO Reference

GovCom continues working on BPR601 and BPR602, which contain references to the Chief Technical Officer, and must be modified to be aligned with current practice. Work on these rules is expected to be completed in the first guarter of 2026.

Board Officer Elections

At the annual meeting on December 1, 2025, GovCom will oversee elections of RRC Board Officers for the 2026 calendar year. A separate communication to Board members and alternatives on this process will be circulated prior to the annual meeting.

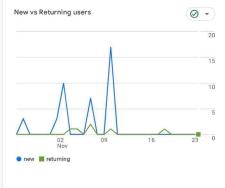

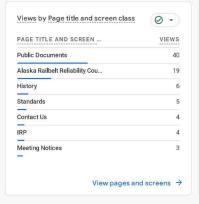

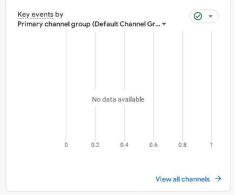

WHEREAS, Alaska Statue (AS) 42.05.762(3)(C) states, "An electric reliability organization shall establish rules to provide fair and impartial procedures for the enforcement of reliability standards"; and

WHEREAS, the RRC has since revised its processes to incorporate the penalty matrix within each Reliability Standard not as an individual document; and

WHEREAS, the RRC has developed Sanction Guidelines as an Appendix under the Standards Compliance, Monitoring, and Enforcement Program (CMEP) ER2; and

WHEREAS, the RRC Bylaws Section 2.3.6.3(q) states that an affirmative vote of the Supermajority is required to initiate, approve, and file with the RCA.

WHEREAS, the Manager of this development, Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) member David Hilt, has developed the Sanction Guidelines through a Working Group process in accordance with the provisions of the Product Development Rule (ER1), per section 5.0 of the Rule Amendments Rule (ER9); and

WHEREAS, the Manager has submitted the required documentation, per 3 Alaska Administrative Code (AAC) 46.470 and section 8 of ER1.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board:

- 1. Approves the proposed revisions to ER2, adding Appendix C Sanction Guidelines; and
- 2. Directs the CEO and regulatory counsel to file the revised rules and the associated record of development with the RCA.

PURPOSE:

This memorandum provides justification for amending the agreement and sole source contract with the University of Fairbanks, to include Phase II work determining the Alaska Value of Lost Load (VoLL).

BACKGROUND:

UAF department Alaska Center for Energy and Power (ACEP) was procured in June 2025 to conduct research on the best approach for conducting a Value of Lost Load (VOLL) study for Alaska Railbelt Utilities. ACEP reviewed literature on existing VOLL estimation methodologies with a focus on cold climate grids. ACEP has completed the review and provided a recommended approaches to calculate the VOLL for the Alaska Railbelt. The VOLL is a critical part of the Integrated Resource Plan (IRP) development needed to evaluate portfolios for the determination of greatest value.

JUSTIFICATION:

In accordance with Section 8.3 of Board Policy Contracting and Purchasing (BP401), the following justification supports the waiver of competitive procurement requirements:

Specialized Expertise: UAF/ACEP specializes in Alaska energy research and has expertise in calculating the value of lost load—qualifying under Section 8.3(1) of BP401.

Efficiency and Responsiveness: UAF/ACEP familiarity with RRC's requirements and its work on the development of the recommended approach will allow for expedited completion of the project.

This request aligns with the waiver criteria outlined in BP401 Section 8.3(1) and 8.3(3), which allow for sole source contracting in cases involving professional or specialized services.

CONCLUSION:

Approval is requested for the RRC to amend the existing agreement and sole source contract with UAF/ACEP increase the amount by a not to exceed amount of \$74,914 and with a term of January 5, 2026, through June 30, 2026, and for the Board to waive the competitive procurement requirements of BP401 pursuant to Section 8.2. These services are within the Proposed Budget Account 923523 – Integrated Resource Plan Consultancy.

SUBJECT: Justification for Chief Executive Officer Compensation Increase

PURPOSE:

This memorandum provides justification for a 2.4% increase in CEO compensation, effective December 1, 2025, based upon the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics Consumer Price Index for the Anchorage area for August 2025.

BACKGROUND:

The Governance Committee (GovCom) conducted its annual review of executive compensation and considered economic indicators relevant to Alaska. The Alaska Department of Labor and Workforce Development COLI for August 2025 reflects a 2.4% increase, which serves as the basis for this recommendation.

On November 14, 2025, the Governance Committee unanimously approved recommending this adjustment to the Board.

JUSTIFICATION:

Cost of living adjustment ensures alignment of CEO compensation with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics Consumer Price Index for the Anchorage area, ending in the month of August 2025, ensuring pay remains competitive and fair relative to inflationary pressures in Alaska. Maintaining compensation parity with regional economic conditions supports retention and stability in executive leadership. The adjustment will be applied to the current base salary and funded within the approved FY2026 operating budget.

CONCLUSION:

The Governance Committee recommends that the Board approve a 2.4% increase in CEO compensation, effective December 1, 2025.
